This Thursday marks the first anniversary of the death of our beloved pastor, Fr. Evan Patrick Harkins. No doubt this milestone will stir our emotions and may re-open the wounds of our grief. On Friday morning I will offer a Requiem Low Mass (Traditional Latin) for the repose of his soul. On Monday, February 1st, a Requiem High Mass (Traditional Latin) will be offered at 7pm at Saint James Parish. All parishioners are welcome to attend either or both of these liturgies. The Church has always walked a balance between hopeful remembrance in mourning and a trusting commendation of the dead to the Mercy of God, which is, ultimately, our only salvation. Grief is a normal human emotion, one in which Our Lord himself shared, as he wept at the death of his friend, Lazarus (John 11:35). Sometimes, we just need to cry. Shortly after this tragic moment in the life of our parish, the world was plunged into concerns about the Coronavirus, from which I hope we are beginning to emerge. Nevertheless, many of the normal means of processing grief (most of which involve gathering with loved ones in prayer and fellowship) were short-circuited by the lockdowns and restrictions which have been in place since mid-March. While time may provide distance, and even perspective, it does not heal grief. In normal times, an anniversary such as this is bound to find us revisiting regrets and asking, once again, WHY? When I returned to Saint James in February, I had no illusions that this would be an easy time for any of us. I also never anticipated the impact that the world health crisis would have on us. Please be assured that each of you are in my prayers as we continue to mourn, even as we move forward with Hope. I am also hopeful that, as Coronavirus restrictions begin to lift, we can offer more parish-based opportunities to process our grief. If you have any ideas about what that might look like, please do not hesitate to contact me. As always, my contact information is on the front of the bulletin.

Eternal Rest grant unto him, O Lord, and may Perpetual Light shine upon him. May he rest in Peace. Amen. May his soul and the souls of all the Faithful Departed, through the Mercy of God, rest in Peace. Amen. May the Peace of God, which is beyond all understanding keep your hearts and your minds in the knowledge and love of His Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ.
