Rogation Processions This Week

Traditionally, the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday prior to Ascension Thursday are observed as minor "Rogation Days". "Rogation" comes from the Latin "rogare," which means "to ask," and Rogation Days are days during which we seek to ask God's mercy, that we may avert the chastisements He makes



manifest through natural disasters, and ask for His blessings, particularly with regard to farming, gardening, and other agricultural pursuits. They are set aside to remind us how radically dependent we are on God through His creation, and how prayer can help protect us from nature's often cruel ways. Historically, the Rogation Days began in response to plagues and famines in the middle ages. It is therefore appropriate that we revive their observance during this time of pandemic, continuing to pray: 1. for the healing and complete recovery of all those who have contracted COVID-19; 2. for the complete eradication of this Coronavirus; 3. for the protection of health-care professionals and others who may be exposed to the Coronavirus; and 4. for the long-term stability of the economy, in general, especially for the food-supply chain.

We will conduct a traditional outdoor procession, followed by a low Mass in the Extraordinary Form on two days this week:

- 4:30pm on Tuesday at St. Patrick Parish.
- 4:30pm on Wednesday at St. James Parish.

While the faithful are welcome to attend these events, please remember to observe social distancing and other prescribed health directives.
