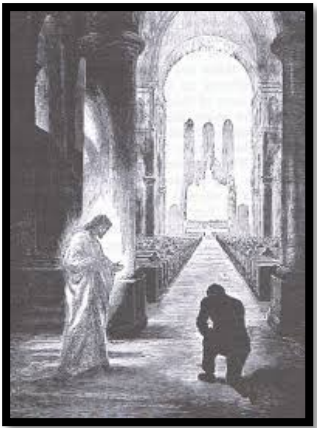


The Surrender Novena
