Rushing Christmas, and not thinking about what Christ wants us to be, are signs of a culture absorbed in itself, so that it becomes no greater than itself. That old maxim is poignant no matter how many times we repeat it: " A man wrapped up in himself becomes a very small package." More important than wrapping gifts in this season, is the obligation to unwrap ourselves: to



confess to Christ our failings and our desire to live life as He wants it, so that we might rejoice with Him forever and never be separated from Him.

Our culture is enduring a severe test of itself. If Christ does not rule our minds and hearts, mere humans will try to do it, and they will do it badly. When the Judges of Israel wanted a merely human king, Samuel warned them: "He will take the best of your fields, vineyards, and olive groves and give them to his officials. He will tithe your flocks and you yourselves will become slaves" (1 Samuel 8:14, 17).
