Saint James will be offering a traditional *Tenebrae*

service on Wednesday evening, April 13 at 7pm. *Tenebrae*, which means "darkness" is a traditional combination of anticipated matins and vespers (from the Divine Office), a series of psalms and readings from the Lamentations of the Prophet Jeremiah to be prayed during Holy Week. A unique feature of *Tenebrae* is the candelabra from which a candle is extinguished after each psalm until only one candle remains (which represents Jesus Christ). This symbolizes the encroaching darkness as the Passion of the Lord draws near. The psalms and readings will be chanted in Latin. This provides a unique opportunity to quiet one's soul in meditation on the Love of Jesus expressed by his Passion. Please join us.
