Thoughts by Father, Jonathan Davis

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The weekend we begin Holy Week. It is the holiest week of the year. All of the mysteries of our faith receive their power from what Jesus Christ accomplished this week on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday. Let us enter into this week with all our whole heart, uniting ourselves to the events of the last days of Jesus' life. I invite you to participate in the Holy Week services here with grateful hearts for what our Lord did for each of us.

From a Homily on Palm Sunday by St. Andrew of Crete, Bishop (640-750 AD) Today he returns from Bethany and proceeds of his own free will toward his holy and blessed passion, to consummate the mystery of our salvation. Let us run to accompany him as he hastens toward Jerusalem, and imitate those who met him then, not by covering his path with garments, olive branches or palms, but by doing all we can to prostrate ourselves before him by being humble and by trying to live as he would wish. Then we shall be able to receive the Word at his coming, and God, whom no limits can contain, will be within us, so let us spread before his feet, not garments or soulless olive branches, which delight the eye for a few hours and then wither, but ourselves, clothed in his grace, or rather, clothed completely in him. We who have been baptized into Christ must ourselves be the garments that we spread before him. Now that the crimson stains of our sins have been washed away in the saving waters of baptism and we have become white as pure wool, let us present the conqueror of death, not with mere branches of palms but with the real rewards of his victory. Let our souls take the place of the welcoming branches as we join today in the children's holy song: Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Blessed is the king of
