Divine Mercy – Novena of Chaplets Continues

"I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw therefrom strength and refreshment and whatever grace they have need of in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209). For each of the nine days, starting on Good Friday, our Lord gave Saint Faustina a different intention:

Day 1 - All mankind, especially sinners

Day 2 - The souls of priests and religious

Day 3 - All devout and faithful souls

Day 4 - Those who do not believe in God and those who do not vet know Jesus

Day 5 - The souls who have separated themselves from the Church

Day 6 - The meek and humble souls and the souls of little children

Day 7 - The souls who especially venerate and glorify His mercy

Day 8 - The souls detained in purgatory

Day 9 - The souls who have become lukewarm

The Divine Mercy Novena will be prayed at the MIR House of Prayer Chapel at 3 pm every day from Good Friday through Divine Mercy Sunday. The Chapel will close from noon Holy Thursday until noon on Easter for the Tridiuum, opening just for the Novena prayers.
