Classical Update from our Principal, Jennifer Saunders

By now, I'm sure that most if not all of you are aware of our introduction into classical education beginning next year. While it is true that we are planning to ease into our transition, I do have a few thoughts to share regarding a basic structure of implementation.

As I've discussed in an earlier newsletter, we will begin with history. Each grade level will be assigned a historical era. History and as much reading/literature as possible will revolve around that era. Students will learn the history of each designated era, but they will also create artwork and other projects of that time period. Each grade level will create a timeline of events of their historical studies. There is so much potential for projects for each class to complete!

Following is a possible plan for historical study:
Grade K: Cradle of Civilization (Creation to 530 BC)
Grade 1: Greek Civilization (1300 BC - 323 BC)
Grade 2: Roman Civilization (753 BC - 476 AD)
Grade 3: Medieval (476 AD- 1453 AD)
Grade 4: Modern Times (Renaissance/Exploration) (1453 AD - 1850 AD)

Grade 5: The American Year (1492 - 1945)
Grade 6: The Ancient Year (Creation - 476 AD)
Grade 7: The Christendom Year (400 AD - 1650 AD)
Grade 8: The New World Year (1492 AD - 1968 AD)

If you notice, the later grades repeat the time periods of the early grades. This will allow teachers to cover material in the greater depth that older students need.

Mrs. Goettemoeller will also be participating in training for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, level 1 this summer. We are hoping to begin implementation of what she learns in our preschool this fall. We are so excited about this new endeavor! It truly is an exciting time for St. James students.
