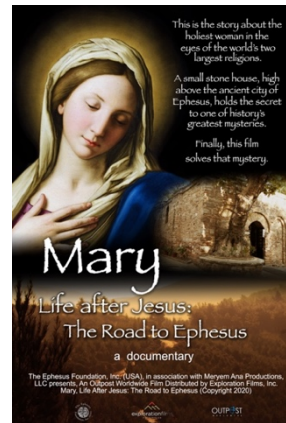
CCD Religion Classes (K thru 8th Grade) begin on Sunday, September 19th
