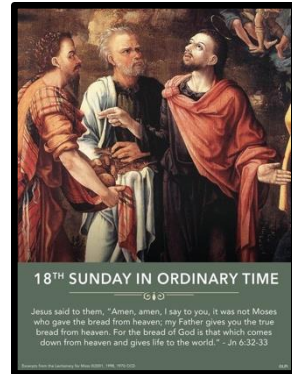

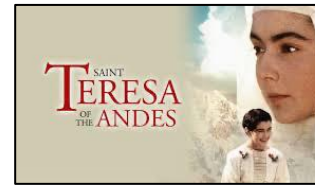

#### St. Teresa of the Andes:

##### The Story of the First Chilean Saint

A beautiful, epic mini-series produced in Chile that tells the story of the inspiring life of the new young Carmelite saint who lived in the 20th century, died at the age of just 19 years old, and was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1993. St. Teresa of Jesus of the Andes, known officially as "St. Teresa of the Andes", grew up in a close-knit, upper middle class Catholic family in Santiago, Chile, was very popular with her friends and relatives, entered Carmel at age 19, and died before her 20<sup>th</sup> birthday. So what is it about this young, modern American saint that caused the Church to recognize her heroic virtue and sanctity at such a young age? Though she was a Carmelite for less than a year, she possessed a refreshing sanctity and message that will resonate with all lovers of Christ, especially with the youth of today. That inspiring story of Chile's first saint, and America's newest and youngest saint, is revealed in this definitive film on St. Teresa of the Andes.

## THOUGHTS FROM FATHER JONATHAN DAVIS

"I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." After Jesus feeds the thousands of people miraculously by multiplying the five loaves and two fish, the people search for Him because they want more bread and fish. What Jesus gives them is better than any bread. He teaches them that He is the Bread of Life and anyone who eats of this Bread will live forever. He teaches them that this Bread is even better than the miraculous bread, the manna, which the Israelites ate in the desert. The Bread that Jesus gives us is His Flesh. His Flesh is true food and his Blood is true drink. For this reason, we call the Eucharist, the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar. The price for us to be able to have the Eucharist in our churches, is the death of our Savior Jesus Christ. Jesus lives in the tabernacle for us, waiting for us, thirsting for us. St. Francis of Assisi wrote "What wonderful majesty! What stupendous condescension! O sublime humility! That the Lord of the whole universe, God and the Son of God, should humble Himself like this under the form of a little bread, for our salvation." If you have an opportunity, please come to spend time with our Lord on Monday nights for Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction between 6-7pm.
