

# Thoughts by Father Jonathan Davis

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ. I want to thank you so much for your prayers for my dad, John, who died on August 14th the Vigil of the Assumption. He was blessed to have a priest with him when he died to give him last rites and the Apostolic Pardon. He died just after I finished offering the 5pm Vigil Mass for him at St. James. I greatly appreciate all of your prayers and support. One of my dad's favorite religious quotes is from the Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen which is "The greatest love story of all time is contained in a tiny white Host." Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ gives us his Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist. He says, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." The Catechism of the Catholic Church in paragraph 1413 states "By the consecration the transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is brought about. Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real, and substantial manner: his Body and his Blood, with his soul and his divinity. (Council of Trent)." Our Lord Jesus Christ the night before he died instituted this Sacrament of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. He has sacrificed Himself to be present with us here today in the tabernacle. Let us ask ourselves, in what ways can I offer to Him a sacrifice out of love and gratitude for Him.
