

Laziness, one of the seven deadly sins, is probably the most underrated of all of them. Most of our sins, vices and struggles come from lazy habits acquired in our early childhood, when we did not struggle sufficiently to live a life of sanctity because we had no idea what was going on, and because we already had the bad influence of concupiscence on us.

Laziness is usually mistaken for not doing anything, however, often times it manifests itself in a flurry of activity that deep down we know is misguided or useless. It is for this reason that laziness enslaves us to do more work, busy work, mindless work or repetition, with no goal, or no spiritual offering attached to it. We literally need to work smarter, not harder – or more accurately, work deeper. Remember that we become Holy not by doing good things, but by doing the good things that God asks us to

If laziness is a cancer in our soul, then acedia is the metastasis. Acedia is spiritual laziness, the belief that things have to be the same, that I cannot improve, that I will not even try to move from where I am. Don't talk to me, don't tell me, I don't want to hear it, this is the way I am and this is who I am, and I cannot change.

No! You can change, your family can change, the Church can change, the world can change. Do not let the enemy convince you otherwise and make today the day when you take the first step towards that radiant sanctity you will find at the end of time.
