This Sunday we celebrate the 1st Sunday of Advent. The word Advent means "coming." Many of us are busy making preparations for Christmas celebrations but let us remember to prepare our hearts for the coming of the Messiah. We do this especially through prayer, meditation on sacred scripture, confession, and Eucharistic adoration. We are called to turn towards our Lord, awaiting His final coming. This is why Catholic Churches from ancient times, were built facing the East, to help people think about the return of Christ. Churches were built in this direction to remind people that at the end of time Jesus will appear to all the world in the sky appearing to return from the East, like the rising sun, according to His words, like lightning coming from the East to the West (Matthew 24:27). For thousands of years people faced the East together at Mass in prayerful anticipation of the return of the Messiah. This is called ad *orientem* worship, toward the east. Some Catholic churches could not be built towards the East but still the people would pray in the same direction together. In our church we actually face the west, but together the priest with the people face the crucifix and face towards the tabernacle. By celebrating Mass this way, we are facing a liturgical East remembering that we are on this journey together to encounter Christ and wait for his return Who will return like the rising morning sun to all the peoples of the earth. So the priest is not *factor of the* utrning his back to the people, but he is one with the people walking in the same direction towards Christ, and looking forward to His return. Jesus is the light of the world and He is called the Sun of Justice. His birth brought light to the world, like the sun rising in the morning from the East. This is what Advent is about. We prepare for the coming of Christ at the end of time while remembering and spiritually preparing for his coming on Christmas. Let us spend this time with Mary, the mother of Christ, meditating on how the joy in her heart increased each day during this month until the birth of her son, Jesus Christ, the Savior of the World. Mother Mary, guide us during this advent to vour Son.
