Thoughts by Father Benjamin Fenlon

Merry Christmas everybody!

During this Christmas season, which is well underway, I have been reflecting on the Roman Canon.

This beautiful prayer is the prayer that the priest says on his own during Mass, inside of which is the Consecration of the Blessed Eucharist.

The prayers immediately following the Consecration of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ are called the 'anamnesis', the Memorial.

They are three prayers which follow on from the ancient Jewish structure of praying, which involves firstly reminding God of his past mercies, and then presenting to God this current offering, which in the case of the Mass is the Eucharist.

The anamnesis, or Memorial, ends when the priest stands erect and makes the sign of the

When I started celebrating Mass last year, I soon realized that there was a certain sacred silence with these prayers. At least to me, it felt like being on the mountaintop, alone with God, offering the Sacred Host to Him.

On the 1st of January, as I celebrated Mass in the Cathedral, we received what I would say was a beautiful but simple grace - as the Memorial began, a cloud (I think!) covered the Cathedral, and so the only real light in the Church was from the electric lights over the Altar. As the Anamnesis ended, that cloud lifted, and the Church was flooded with light

Let's try and live the Roman Canon with faith and fervor. This is what we come to Mass for every day. This is the moment that heaven meets earth. Make sure to offer up your soul with the bread and wine at the offertory, and love and adore the Sacred Host as it is being elevated - in the hands of the priest, and on the Cross.


