

This week we celebrate two important feast days. On July 22 we celebrate the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene and on July 25 we celebrate the Feast of St. James the Greater. As you might know, there are two St. James's. St. James the Greater and St. James the Lesser. They are both Apostles. James the Greater is better known in the Gospels, because he was taken apart by our Lord with Peter and John to witness the Transfiguration and Christ's Agony in the Garden. He is the brother of John the Apostle. St. James the Lesser became Bishop of Jerusalem. St. James the Greater traveled to Spain, and on July 25 his bones were transferred from Jerusalem to Spain after his martyrdom when he was beheaded in Jerusalem in 44 A.D. On Thursday we will have Mass at 8am for the Feast of St. James. St. Mary Magdalene was present at Christ's tomb on Easter Sunday and carried the good news to the apostles still gathered in Jerusalem. For this reason she is known as the "Apostle to the Apostles." When I was in Rome for one summer as a seminarian, I went to visit the church of St. John the Baptist, very close to the Vatican, where they have the foot of St. Mary Magdalene encased in a golden foot reliquary. There is an opening in one part where you can see her bones. That was the first foot to carry the message of the Resurrection to the world when she ran to tell the Apostles the good news of Whom she had seen! Seeing and venerating this holy relic left a big impression on me. Like St. James and St. Mary Magdalene we must remember that we are called to carry the message of the Gospel to the world. We have seen Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. May we announce this good news to the world. When we encounter our Lord in the Eucharist at Mass or adoration we should be transformed by a fire of love and gratitude towards Christ. Starting this week, on the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene we will have Eucharistic Adoration on Monday nights with confessions and benediction from 6pm-7pm. I invite all of you to come to adore our Eucharistic King and Lord. St. Mary Magdalene is a model of Eucharist love and adoration for us. She adored Christ by anointing his feet with rich aromatic oil, just as we use aromatic incense to reverence our Lord in the Eucharist. Come let us adore Him on Monday nights!
