You are invited to join **Father Angelo Bartulica** for a rosary, Mass, light luncheon, and an update on his mission in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

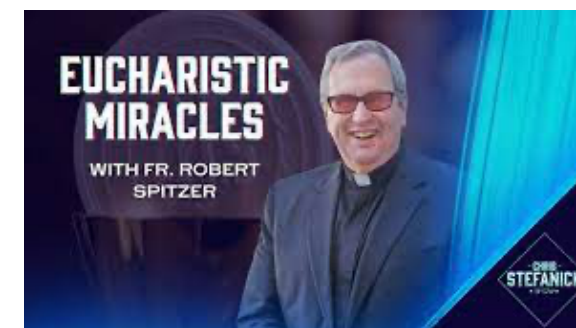
