Thoughts by Father Jonathan Davis

On this second Sunday of Lent, we hear the story of Christ's Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. In the Transfiguration Christ reveals His Divinity to His apostles Peter, James, and John in a visible way. "While He was praying His face changed in appearance and His clothing became dazzling white." (Luke 9:28) In the Mass, the removal of the chalice veil at the offertory represents the stripping off of the garments of Christ on Good Friday. This is a very significant part of the Mass. We remember how when the soldiers removed Christ's garments, pieces of His flesh which adhered to His garment, were torn off his body also. In this part of the Mass, we are entering into the mystery of Christ's Passion. In the Mass we are called to an interior participation in the Passion of Christ and to meditate on His sufferings.

During His Passion, Christ took on all of our sins in His Body. In His terrible sufferings, we can see the ugliness of sin. The glory of His Divinity was veiled by His humanity and his sufferings, but before His Passion, Christ manifested His glory to His apostles in His Transfiguration, becoming bright as the sun, in order to strengthen their hearts and give them hope after they saw His horrible suffering and death. The Transfiguration is a revealing of the Divinity of Christ. Everything in the Mass is significant to the mystery of our Faith and has a rich meaning. When we come to Mass, it is important to prepare ourselves in prayer before the beginning of Mass, in order to participate fruitfully in the Sacrifice of the Mass in which we can relive the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ. In our lives, when we are passing through difficult times, let us remember the glory of the light of the Transfiguration, because Christ our light will be with us to lead us through the darkness and into His wonderful light.

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil; May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; And do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls.
