Thoughts by Father Jonathan Davis

The week we begin Lent on Ash Wednesday. Through Lent we unite ourselves more closely to Christ through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Often, we think about what am I going to give up for Lent? Chocolate, sweets, ice cream, for example. This is good, but we must remember that Lent is also a time of prayer. Ask yourselves, can I give Jesus time each day to converse with him in prayer? 2 minutes. 3 minutes, 5 or 10 minutes of silence? Each day we should dedicate time to pray to God. What is prayer? "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy," said St. Therese of Lisieux.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church: 2559 "Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God. St. John Damascene)" But when we pray, do we speak from the height of our pride and will, or "out of the depths" of a humble and contrite heart? He who humbles himself will be exalted: humility is the foundation of prayer, only when we humbly acknowledge that "we do not know how to pray as we ought," are we ready to receive freely the gift of prayer. "Man is a beggar before God. (St. Augustin)" 2560 "If you knew the gift of God! (John 4:10)" The wonder of prayer is revealed beside the well where we come seeking water: there, Christ comes to meet every human being. It is he who first seeks us and asks us for a drink. Jesus thirsts; his asking arises from the depths of God's desire for us. Whether we realize it or not, prayer is the encounter of God's thirst with ours. God thirsts that we may thirst for Him."
