

Thoughts by Father, Jonathan Davis

As we near the end of this liturgical season and look toward Advent, the Church presents to us readings that help us think about the end of our lives, the End of Time, and the Return of Christ. Our lives and the passage of time in a way, mirror the mysteries of the Holy Rosary. The Joyful Mysteries focus on the Birth of Christ and His infancy. The Luminous Mysteries focus on the life of Christ, His public ministry and events of His life after His infancy but before His death. The Sorrowful Mysteries focus on the end of His Life beginning with His suffering and leading up to His death on the Cross when He said, "It is finished." The Glorious mysteries are what come after, and what we are called to experience. Our lives are a journey to experience the glory of the Resurrection and its fulfillment. The Assumption of Mary's body and soul to Heaven, the Fourth Glorious Mystery is what we also are called to experience. At the end of time, Christ will return in glory to judge the living and the dead. At the sound of the trumpet, the souls of the dead will be reunited to their bodies, and there will take place the Final Judgment. Before the return of Christ, the Church, and all the world will pass through a time of great tribulation, which we can relate to the Sorrowful mysteries. The Catechism says, "Though already present in His Church, Christ's reign is nevertheless yet to be fulfilled "with power and great glory" by the King's return to earth. This reign is still under attack by the evil powers, even though they have been defeated definitively by Christ's Passover (671)" and "Before Christ's second coming the Church must pass through a final trial that will shake the faith of many believers. ⁵⁷³The persecution that accompanies her pilgrimage on earth $\frac{574}{4}$ will unveil the "mystery of iniquity" in the form of a religious deception offering men an apparent solution to their problems at the price of apostasy from the truth. The supreme religious deception is that of the Antichrist, a pseudo-messianism by which man glorifies himself in place of God and of his Messiah come in the flesh. (675)" The antichrist will be an individual person but as St. John says, there are already many antichrists "Children, it is the last hour! As you have heard that antichrist is coming, so now many antichrists have come. From this we know that it is the last hour." I John 2:18. About the End Times and the return of Christ we should not be scared. St. Paul tells us "Do not be terrified out of your senses all at once, and thrown into confusion, by any spiritual utterance, any message or letter purporting to come from us, which suggests that the day of the Lord is close at hand. Do not let anyone find the means of leading you astray. The apostasy must come first; the champion of wickedness must appear first, destined to inherit perdition. This is the rebel who is to lift up his head above every divine name, above all that men hold in reverence, till at last he enthrones himself in God's temple, and proclaims himself as God. (2 Thes. 2:2-5)." He continues "Then it is that the rebel will shew himself; and the Lord Jesus will destroy him with the breath of his mouth, overwhelming him with the brightness of his presence. He will come, when he comes, with all Satan's influence to aid him; there will be no lack of power, of counterfeit signs and wonders." We should not be afraid of these things to come. With the Sacraments we are victorious. Confirmation makes us soldiers of Christ. With Christ we can pass through anything that comes. In the end, the Catechism says, "The Church will enter the glory of the kingdom only through this final Passover, when she will follow her Lord in his death and Resurrection. The kingdom will be fulfilled, then, not by a historic triumph of the Church through a progressive ascendancy, but only by God's victory over the final unleashing of evil, which will cause his Bride to come down from heaven. God's triumph over the revolt of evil will take the form of the Last Judgement after the final cosmic upheaval of this passing world." As Mary walked with her son through his life, passion, and death, we should ask her to walk with us through this world until we meet Christ and experience the glory of the resurrection. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.
