

Thoughts by Father Benjamin Fenlon

Our Lord Jesus Christ revealed to us the true nature of God, and that is that God is a mystery of LOVE – the Father loves the Son, the Son loves the Father, the Holy Spirit is the love of Father and Son.

God created the universe, not because He needed to, but from a sheer abundance of His love, giving being to that which had no being. After the sin of our first parents, Adam and Eve, mankind was stained with original sin, and so to save us, even though we did not deserve it, God chose to take our sin onto Himself and suffer through it.

Each one of us is beloved by God – we were each individually dreamed up by God, God desired each person on this planet to exist, and God decided that each one of us was worth dying for to save.

In theology these two ideas – creation and salvation – always go together as a pair.

So it is that this week I have been meditating a lot on how God cradles you in His heart, always watching over you and caring for you. For God it's personal – you are infinitely special to Him.

We often feel angry about ourselves, impatient with our failings and sins. Do not be upset: God loves you as you are now. He does not love the ideal, but the real you. So you should accept yourself as you are, and offer yourself up to Him.

This is the reason the final, pro-life push before the Amendment 3 vote in November is so important: God loves each of those babies that are in danger of being destroyed. God assigns an infinite value to each of them. God thinks that each of them is worth giving life, even if the circumstances in which they were conceived were not ideal.

A lot of vulnerable women who consider abortion, do so because they are scared, angry with themselves, ashamed of being exposed as a sinner in public.

Remember, God does not love the ideal you, He loves the real you. If He gave a baby to you, it is not a life ruining event, or a burden, but a moment of trust: God believes in you, God believes that you can show to that little kiddo the love He holds for them. God believes that you will succeed. And we, the Catholic Community, need to make sure that all women know and feel that even if they do have a baby out of wedlock, they will be accepted and loved by us, just as they are accepted and loved by God. Whatever way the vote goes in November – and we must fight strenuously to make sure we win, there is still time – a true pro-life atmosphere is one where a woman is not even tempted to do anything but love and cherish her precious little baby!
